

## Assumptions - 2050


- Global population will grow to 9 BN and get older
  - Most of the additional people in Africa and Asia
  - Migration will be massive
- Turbulence as the world rebalances to new centres of economic power
  - New centres may not share the value systems of the West
- Technology (info, cogno, bio, nano) will continue to introduce changes in
  - Political and social systems: Personal capacity and lifestyles
- Ecological, energy and environmental limits tested or breached
  - Population lives in cities (70% by 2050)
  - New middle class uses electricity, travels, eats meat
  - Sea levels rise


















#### Scenarios from "In Safe Hands"

   Supply Chain Managers -----








## What paradigm changes?

- Will our economy and society be similar to now?
  - or
  - Will there be a new paradigm?
- Does geography matter?
  - If yes, with no new paradigm, its like now but struggling
  - what sort of new paradigm might there be? City states?
  - or
  - If geography does not matter, with no new paradigm we have our current official future, ICT enabled globalisation
  - A new paradigm could be based on virtual ICT enabled global loyalties, so based on affinity groups?





#### Four scenarios







#### **Second Hand**

- Capitalism, nation states, democracy and western value systems still dominant as concepts,
  - though not all countries/regions are moving to embrace these
- Nearest to current paradigm but
  - Degradation of nation state capability
  - Technology has fed the population
- Systems in constant stress
  - But no new ways forward
  - International institutions stagger on







#### Globalisation


- Capitalism, democracy and western values still dominant
  - Significant stand-outs and international tensions
  - Global markets
  - National governments in retreat
- Evolution of global governance
  - Rethinking of taxation & pensions
  - Food revolution successful
  - ICT underpins all
- Lack of diversity leads to break down by 2030
  - Inability to handle systemic volatility
  - Break down of international institutions

## **Affinity Groups**

- A crisis has caused the breakdown of the global system
- Society has re-formed around affinity groups
  - Multiple value systems accommodated
  - Democracy not seen as universal good
  - Complex arrangements of nation states and communities of affinity groups
- How do international issues get addressed
  - e.g. regulation
  - e.g. systemic challenges?







## City Societies


- A crisis has caused the breakdown of the global system
- Society has re-formed around city states
  - Cities as wealth clusters "brands"
  - Failure of nation states
  - Democracy, capitalism and western values competing with other organising concepts, UN etc disappear
  - Cities may co-operate or may be at war
- Global commons abandoned
  - Conflicts in values, fewer implicit norms

- Second Hand
  - It may be as good as it gets!
- Globalisation
  - Homogeneity the cause of volatility and break down
- Affinity Groups
  - Best for London as global city
- City Societies
  - How real this one feels

  - Affinity Groups?




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## City Societies

- e.g.Benjamin Barber: If Mayors Ruled the World: Dysfunctional Nations, Rising Cities
  - Detroit and suburbs
  - Bangkok vs Thailand
  - London vs UK
- Effect of city "brand"
  - What is Manchester's brand?
  - Aspiration 2050?


